

Changing Lanes Project

Project summary

London Action Trust (LAT) have been funded by Barking and Dagenham council and London Councils to deliver the Changing Lanes Project.

The project comprises of the following strands:

- To recruit a group of young people (13-19 years old) from the borough and engage them on accredited learning courses in Web Design/ Communication & Presentation Skills.
- To give young people the opportunity to create their own Youth Website Portal exploring issues that are important to them (including Anti-Social Behaviour, Street Crime, Gang Awareness as well as other topics they choose - Music/Fashion/Sports etc.....)
- To offer 10 young people (13-19 years old) a mediation programme in the borough.
- To support young people to deliver peer education workshops in local schools/ youth & community centres to other young people on topics of Anti-Social Behaviour/ Personal & Community Safety.
- To carry out consultations with young people in other boroughs around the development and content of the Youth Website Portal.

Delivery:

2 groups of young people will be developed;

- “Techies” these young people will design, run and maintain the website once they have achieved the accreditation in Web Design.
- “Talkies” these young people will deliver peer education workshops, to other young people, once they have achieved the accreditation in Communication and Presentation skills.
